

# White Wines

## *Sauvignon Blancs*

### **Robertson Sauvignon Blanc**

**R40**

**R110**

Our House Wine, which is chosen to be consumed by the glass and with special friends, who are able to listen to the same stories day in and day out. Useful when you need to review a dreary day's work.

### **Porcupine Ridge Sauvignon Blanc**

**R45**

**R125**

From Boekenhoutdkloof. This wine will bring back memories of finding porcupine quills in the veldt. There's probably one still stuck in your sock draw or some other place where you keep special memories.

### **KWV Sauvignon Blanc**

**R45**

**R130**

Ko-operatiewe Wijnbouwers Vereniging van Zuid Afrika once controlled all wine exports from South Africa. There are still magnificent KWV buildings in the Cape, that record the long history of wines. This is a fresh delicious wine, filled with hints of forgotten corners of some of the most scenic vineyards on earth.

### **Noble Hills Sauvignon Blanc**

**R135**

The best scenery in the Winelands produces some of the finest grapes. Noble Hills blend their own sauvignon blanc grapes with some from Elgin and Walker Bay, to give a wonderful result.

### **Brampton Sauvignon Blanc**

**R145**

Brampton's name pays tribute to the champion Jersey bull "Brampton Beacon Bloomer", originally owned by the Bull family, and was imported from Canada to add vigour to a local Jersey herd. That's no bull.

### **Durbanville Hills Sauvignon Blanc**

**R50**

**R150**

Ever popular for those bright hot Cape days...when even the crows hang around with open mouths. A popular Sauvignon Blanc, often with ice added, but only when in Cape Town.

### **Kloovenberg Sauvignon Blanc**

**R55**

**R155**

Grown and bottled in the scenic Riebeeck-Kasteel area, where you'll find the oldest hotel in South Africa. No prizes for guessing what it is called.

### **Fairview Darling Sauvignon Blanc**

**R160**

The first wine was produced on Fairview in 1699, so they've had years of practice. I think this wine, perfectly portrays, the art of wine making. Perhaps you should judge for yourself?

### **Diemersdal Sauvignon Blanc**

**R60**

**R165**

With literally hundreds of Sauvignon Blancs to choose from, Diemersdal is such a wonderful wine and a favourite of our Customers for quite some time.

Keeps well, sells well, drinks well and after a glass all is well. Oh well!

### **First Sighting Sauvignon Blanc**

The day I visited Elim, it was blustery, with skies full of heavy cloud and patches of bright sun. I'm sure the wind always blows in Elim. It makes one wonder what oceans it has passed over on its way to the southern tip of Africa and how many ancient mariners it has blown off course. You are in a safe harbour now.

### **Rickety Bridge Sauvignon Blanc**

**R175**

The last wine to make the Barristers Wine List. A lonely tasting sample was left behind the bar, with its cousin, the Rickey Bridge Chenin. We discovered them one Tuesday and the rest, as they say, is history.

### **Lomond**

**R65      R180**

At 34°34' south you can taste the freshness from the south Atlantic in every sip!

### **Fat Bastard Sauvignon Blanc**

**R65      R185**

Crisp, fresh and vivid. Unlike the utterances of the "Gentlemen" sitting on table 64.

### **Thelema Sauvignon Blanc**

**R195**

The name says it all; such a sensuous word, close your eyes and feel this soft wine on your palate. It conjures up images of peace, tranquillity and a good time to be had.

### **Ataraxia Sauvignon Blanc**

**R200**

Greek for "a serene state of mind, free from worry and preoccupation". I get nervous trying to pronounce ataraxia, but then again, it's normally only when I want to order the second bottle.

### **Cape Point Cape Town Sauvignon Blanc**

**R235**

Grown on the slopes of Chapman's Peak and a stone's throw from Misty Cliffs, a bracing, crisp, deliciously cold Sauvignon Blanc. Living in Paradise means I sleep on the same mountain as does this magnificent wine.

### **Springfield Life From Stone**

**R245**

Drink with Fish! Why? Rather drink Springfield with someone with an expense account!

## *Chenin Blancs*

### **Robertson Chenin**

**R40**      **R110**

It is spelt with a 'C' but pronounced with a 'Shh'. Perhaps it has to do with the second glass?

### **Porcupine Ridge Chenin**

**R45**      **R125**

Prickly little wine...

### **Ken Forester Petit Chenin**

**R130**

A wine I first met at Barristers...we parted company for a while, but are back together now.

### **KWV Chenin**

**R45**      **R135**

A rich opulent nose with flavours of stone fruit, quince, spice and lime, enhanced with a subtle, perfumed lift. The flush of flavours is like the iridescent colours of a train-rattling peacock. Tastes like a Chenin to me.

### **Kleine Zalze Chenin Cellar Selection**

**R50**      **R140**

A mild and simple wine, so easy to drink; after a long day, when you seem to have used up your decisions for the week, go with Kleine Zalze. It never disappoints.

### **Mulderbosch "Steen op Hout"**

**R155**

This Estate is owned by an American wine import company who found that the USA demand for Mulderbosch was so strong they needed to secure the source, I don't blame them.

### **Waterford Pecan Stream**

**R60**      **R165**

Soft on the pallet, like the kid glove lining of your purse. It is so agreeable, so sip on.

### **Secateurs Chenin Blanc**

**R170**

A most delicious wine...but then I do have a sweet tooth and have always been a big fan of Chenin Blanc. A wine that does go with old friends, old jokes and simple honest food.

### **Rickety Bridge Chenin Blanc**

**R175**

Having listed the Rickety Bridge sauvignon blanc, we felt sorry for the Chenin. Glad we did!

### **Fairview Darling Chenin Blanc**

**R65**      **R180**

Fairview was established in 1693 and has been in the Back family since 1937. As a Chenin fan this is my favourite. Crisp yet, not quite dry. Brings peace to the world after a crazy.

### **Fat Bastard Chenin Blanc**

**R65**      **R185**

Your glass is always half full when the Fat Bastard is at your table.

### **Kloof Street Chenin Blanc**

**R190**

From the Mullineux & Leeu Vineyards, who have consistently been recognized as South Africa's top vineyard. The Kloof Street always reminds me of being in town on a warm summer's night and enjoying food in a restaurant on Kloof Street, up on the hill.

Whatever glass you choose, may it be more full than empty?

### **Robertson Beukett**

**R40**

**R110**

Full of ripe grapes, from the Robertson Valley, this semi-sweet wine is for the sweeter palate.

### **Leopards Leap Chardonnay Pinot Noir**

**R45**

**R130**

I really like this wine. Crisp, clean label and a touch of pink in the bottle; happiness all around.

### **Buitenverwachting - Buiten Blanc**

**R50**

**R135**

The perennial favourite; a classic Cape Town white wine. Made on our doorstep, from grapes sourced throughout the Western Cape.

### **Pierre Jordan Tranquille**

**R50**

**R145**

From the makers of Haute Cabrière - if you prefer something not quite dry and not quite sweet -you'll always find peace in a glass or two. It is after all "A still or quiet" Pierre Jordan, with a single fermentation, unlike the MCC Brut we have on the list.

### **Haute Cabrière Chardonnay Pinot Noir**

**R70**

**R195**

The benchmark and original chard-pinot blend. When in doubt, stick with what you know!

*... and now for something a little different ...*

### **Leopard's Leap Natura - De-alcoholised white**

**R130**

This is a great alternative to grape juice, when you want to be part of the party, but not make an idiot of yourself. With <0.5% ABV you can still drive home and wake up in time for work!

### **Terra Del Capo Pinot Grigio**

**R135**

An easy drinking summer wine produced by one of South Africa's most successful families.

### **Anura Pinot Grigio**

**R145**

Reminds me of overseas visits, where Pinot Grigio is big and affordably delicious.

### **Cederberg Bukettraube**

**R185**

Only 77 hectares left in the world. A flowery, apricot scented sweet wine. Soft and delicious.

### **Spice Route Obscura Qvevri - made & matured in a qvevri**

**R255**

Made in the traditional Georgia style, by fermenting grapes, along with their stalks, skins, pips and with naturally present wild yeasts, in large, handmade terracotta vessels, known as qvevri. Qvevri wines are fermented and are high in anti-oxidants. With no sulphur added and organically made, they are high in anti-oxidants the wine closest to nature on this list.

Not for the faint hearted, they are meant to be enjoyed with food and go well with a cheese platter.

*Be warned, qvevri wines are different, so please be sure when ordering, as once opened the wine is yours and unless corked, we cannot refund you if you don't like it.*

#### **Robertson Chardonnay**

**R40**

**R115**

This is Barristers' "House" Chardonnay. Served at 3°, it is cold and welcome after a long day at the beach, bench, computer, counter, desk, stove, ...or wherever you practice your trade.

#### **Kloovenberg Chardonnay**

**R45**

**R140**

Once owned by the Euvrard family from 1919 to 1958, before being bought by the du Toit family...my wife's maiden name was Euvrard, and so perhaps a family connection to the rich and productive soils of the Riebeek-Kasteel valley?

#### **Anura Chardonnay**

**R50**

**R145**

Built on the back of an optometry business. It's not hard to see why, particularly after a bottle of Anura.

### *Lightly Wooded*

#### **Porcupine Ridge Chardonnay**

**R45**

**R125**

As wily as a porcupine in a pumpkin patch...be careful of the sting in the tail of the chardonnay.

#### **Fat Bastard Chardonnay**

**R65**

**R185**

When "The Big Guy" needs to be entertained, such as, just before increase time, this is the one.

#### **Tierhoek Chardonnay**

**R65**

**R195**

The farm is situated at 760 m above sea level, in the peaks of the Piekenierskloof near Citrusdal. A more famous pass, with an interesting history, wonderful people and great wines, you won't find anywhere else.

#### **Glen Carlou Chardonnay**

**R250**

This tastes like a Chardonnay should – rich, expansive, buttery and indulgent.

**The day he moved out was terrible - That evening she went through hell.  
His absence wasn't a problem - But the corkscrew had gone as well.**

# CHAMPAGNES & SPARKLING WINES

The classic bubbly that everyone aspires to, but sadly, most of us can only afford to look, as it sits on the shelf waiting for the big occasion, when someone else gets to drink some!

### **Pierre Jourdan Brut**

**R60**

**R140**

**R245**

The lime characteristics of the Chardonnay predominate, but are well supported by the Pinot Noir. This MCC is crisp, stimulating and rewarding on the palate, making it our most popular bubbly!

### **Villiera Tradition Brut**

**R160**

**R265**

If you'd like to be different, then this is the one for you. "Made with solar in most stages of production." Presumably this starts in the vineyard in about September of each year? As with any bubbly, do take care as they have a habit of sneaking up on one...

### **Graham Beck Brut Rosé**

**R335**

Flirtatious and fun. This wine has a beautiful salmon-pink colour with strawberry-fruit flavours. A favourite for special those occasions; to be remembered and cherished between two people.

### **Steenberg 1682**

**R355**

The Brut 1682 yields a consistent flavour of fresh, Granny Smith apples with overtones of freshly-baked biscuits rounded by a creamy, yet fresh mouth feel. Made exclusively from chardonnay, it can, if taken in excess, bring on Joanna Lumley behavioural patterns, but remains, always, Absolutely Fabulous.

## *Sparkling Wines*

### **Robertson Sparkling Brut**

**R140**

The classic bubbly that is produced at every family event, especially. Drunk, in vast amounts, when given even the faintest hint of anything mildly worth turning into a celebration.

## *Non-Alcoholic Sparkling Wines*

### **Robertson Sparkling White or Red Grape Juice**

**R130**

This semi-sweet, alcohol-free sparkling grape juice is full of delicate fruit and bubbles; and without the headache.

KWV have the most beautiful buildings scattered throughout the wine lands. Next time you're in Robertson look for their "Moskonfyt" building at the station...and what, may I ask, is "Moskonfyt"?

## **First Sighting Rosé**

**R135**

Shiraz & Grenache. An entry level rosé, for the novice to start a life long journey. Very dry.

## **De Grendel Rosé**

**R55**

**R155**

Pinotage and Cabernet gives this rosé the slightest blush, just a hint of pink; softest of all of our rosés. Peachy cheeks with the faintest blush, bring back thoughts yesterdays, gone by.

## **Vrede en Lust Jess Rosé**

**R160**

Pinotage & Shiraz. Vinified by the sun and produced with a delicate feminine touch.

## **South Hill Rosé**

**R170**

The Elgin Railway Market is a great place to visit and close to South Hill, which is to the east, in the Elgin valley and close to the sea. The cool climate gives this rosé an exceptionally dry and almost salty taste.

## **Delaire Graff Cabernet Franc Rosé**

**R205**

A Pink diamond! Well worth the price.

## **Boschendal Blanc de Noir**

**R125**

The reason you'd like Boschendal Blanc de Noir is that; firstly it tastes delicious, secondly Boschendal is such a beautiful estate and finally, it's been around forever...when did you first discover Boschendal?

## **D'Aria Blush**

**R45**

**R130**

We found this, late on a Wednesday, in Mouille Point. Since then it's been a personal favourite. With all the goodness of red wine, but not the tannins, it's colour, so delicate and taste so delicious.

## **Quando Rosé**

**R145**

Mourvedre, a grape that is difficult to grow and likes "its face in the hot sun and its feet in the water". A bonnie rosé from Bonnieedale.

## **Delheim Pinotage Rosé**

**R60**

**R165**

When you want to escape the crowds from Camps Bay, but enjoy the sunshine, then this is the rosé for you. Delheim has delivered such value to South African Wine Lovers for such a long time and shows no signs of slowing down.

**All you need is love and a little Rosé.**

# The End of the Beginning

A blend of Syrah, Mourvèdre and Viognier. A great wine in which to confide of matters of the heart, but whisper to be heard and contemplate deeply the Wolftrap's response.

### **Diemersdal Matys Red**

**R45      R130**

The label says it all "Create your future, be original, respect your past, take risks, live free, love the planet and celebrate life..." and on Sundays, dance as if no one is watching you.

### **Leopard's Leap Natura - De-alcoholised Red**

**R135**

This is a great alternative to grape juice, when you are the designated driver. Now you can be part of the party, but without the headache!

### **Groote Post The Old Man's Red**

**R55      R160**

This generous, good value wine is made from noble cultivars and it perfectly sums up the adage: old books, old friends and old wine. To be taken in slowly, amidst good conversation or comfortable silence, between friends.

### **Klein Constantia Cabernet Sauvignon Merlot**

**R175**

Everyone knows Constantia, but how well do you know KC merlot?

### **Thelema Mountain Red**

**R65      R180**

This wine is a fresh and exciting blend of Petit Verdot, Merlot, Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Grenache and Cabernet Franc. Something for everyone, and a bit more too.

### **Roodeberg**

**R190**

Named after the red glow on the Paarl mountains at sunset. After one or two you might also start to glow. Growing up, it was only produced for export and I never dreamt we'd have it at Barristers.

### **Hartenberg Cabernet Sauvignon/Shiraz**

**R70      R195**

The perfect foil for a tender Barristers' Fillet. Hartenberg have been producing great wines since 1692. This wine reflects their understanding of nature and attention to detail.

### **Alto Rouge**

**R200**

Alto Rouge seems to have been around forever, which is not surprising, as it comes from South Africa's oldest red wine estate. Consistently good, consistently delicious, it provides stability in changing times.

### **La Motte Millennium**

**R205**

The Millennium has produced a vintage, every year, since 2001. It would be fun to collect a bottle from each year and open them all in 2101... what a legacy! Anton Rupert knew a thing or two, when he bought the farm in 1970 and registered the Millennium name in 1988!

### **Buitenverwagting Meifort**

**R210**

A classic Bordeaux blend of Cab Sav, Merlot & Cab Franc, with a little Malbec & Petite Verdat for good measure. Dripping with serious contemplation and determined resolutions.

### **Vergenoegd Terrace Bay**

**R215**

Vergenoegd does not mean “far enough”, but rather “satisfaction guaranteed” ... and that’s enough from me! Great estate for a picnic where you can feed the ducks!

### **Nicolas van der Merwe**

**R355**

Nico is one of the only South African wine makers, to have made two vintages, in one year...you work that one out. This is one of the gems on our list. If you’ve found it, don’t tell a soul.

### **Hermanuspietersfontein (HPF) Kleinboet**

**R325**

...heleef die oorspronklike naam van Hermanus, soos in 1855 vernoem na die Hollandse onderwyser wat sy skape by die dorpie se fontein laat wei het...al wat ek kan sê is “laat waai!”

### **Rupert & Rothchild Classique**

**R335**

The aristocracy of wines and the closest you will get to a 2009 Château Mouton Rothchild.

### **Springfield “The Work of Time”**

**R355**

It took 9 years from planting to the first harvest; followed by 2 years of barrel maturation and then a further four years of bottle maturation, before finally being released as a classic and complex red blend. As the Owners of Springfield state: “...this long wait, justified only by our passion, does bear fruit. It’s called; The Work of Time”.



## *Pinotage*

### **Robertson Pinotage**

**R50      R135**

Somehow Pinotage used to go with herringbone tweed, briar pipes and obscure books on architecture. Now it goes with anything; as long as you have the tang of a sharp cheese, a leaf of rocket or a smoky hint of pâté on your plate.

### **Beyerskloof Pinotage**

**R65      R185**

A fascinating story of the development of South Africa’s unique wine cultivar – the mighty Pinotage.

### **Vriesenhof Pinotage**

**R70      R195**

Pinotage has the heart of a lion and the tongue of a woman; after drinking a certain quantity you can talk forever and fight like the devil!

### **Fairview Pinotage**

**R230**

Pinotage and a cheese platter...it has to be Fairview.

### **Diemersdal Pinotage**

**R235**

Diemersdal Pinotage is so very popular and we simply could not imagine a red wine list without it!

### **Diemersfontein Pinotage**

**R260**

This is the one! The original coffee/chocolate Pinotage now in its sixteenth vintage. It befriends – It covets – It seduces.

Swartland winery at its best. Bush vines that deliver a scant six tons of grape per hectare with concentrated flavours and typical merlot smoothness. One of the most drinkable wines on the list and a scenic drive from Ducketts Orchid Nursery.

### **KWV Merlot**

Thoughts of breaking new lands and plantings and establishing the wine industry at the southern tip of Africa and the sweat and toil that went into that. What a story!

**R155**

### **Spier Merlot**

More than just the whole Spier thing, that you drive past on the way to Stellenbosch.

This is a wonderful Merlot that truly tastes of blackcurrants and really is velvety smooth on the palate.

**R60**

**R165**

### **Kloovenberg Merlot**

This wine is produced in the "Swartland" which means, 'black country' and which is named after the indigenous Renosterbos, which turns a dark colour at a certain time of the year. The renosterbos, was the favourite food of the rhino's that roamed the Cape in the 1700's.

I always associate the Swartland with wheat fields, fat sheep and wonderful merlots.

**R185**

### **HPF Posmeester**

The label is in Afrikaans and it loosely translated, says that this is an outstanding wine from the Hemel-en-Aarde (Heaven-and-Earth) Valley, near Hermanus.

**R195**

### **De Grendel Merlot**

Founded by the first baronet Sir David Graaff (1859 – 1932), De Grendel overlooks Table Bay and is distinguished by a cool growing climate, resulting in a distinctive and expressive style. Certainly, the aristocrat of the Cape Merlots. Tread lightly. 14.0% is not to be taken lying down.

**R295**

**And, as the Cock crew, those who stood before  
The Tavern shouted — "Open then the Door!  
You know how little while we have to stay,  
And, once departed, may return no more" ..**

# RED WINES

## *Shiraz (Syrah)*

### **Robertson Shiraz**

**R50      R135**

Your dependable supply, of the things in red wine, that are good for you!

### **Noble Hills Shiraz**

**R180**

Six hectares grown on the slopes of the Simonsberg ...the epi-centre of Syrah growing in South Africa.

### **Hartenberg Doorkeeper Shiraz**

**R65      R190**

The keeper of the door. Cross this threshold first and only then can you understand Hartenberg.

### **First Sighting Shiraz**

**R70      R195**

There's not a great deal at Elim, except for wind, sea, sand and scrub. Tucked away, in all of this, is the Strandveld Estate, (Translated: "Stand = Beach, Veldt = a flat area covered in grass or low scrub) an apt name for the area. Being a Shiraz it brings this all together in a wine full of the smells and flavours of the Strandveld.

### **Kloovenberg Shiraz**

**R235**

Medium bodied with soft and silky tannins lead to a spiciness that reminds me of exotic places, bazaars and busy souks. Perhaps a bit of intrigue or a quick trade, but always an interesting story behind each glass and a gradual understanding after each sip. Finally all is revealed.

### **Zandvliet Shiraz**

**R240**

There are few other Shiraz's with such heritage or respect. Zandvliet is synonymous with Shiraz. Drink it and you'll see why.

### **Delaire Graff Shiraz**

**R245**

This juicy, ripe and approachable Shiraz with its ruby colour and purple tints has a spicy white pepper undertone and dark red fruit aromas. Is there a hint of crushed diamonds somewhere?

### **Allesverloren Shiraz**

**R250**

This is one of the wines that goes back a long, long way. We have many happy memories of houses past, with fine dinners shared with special friends...and always an Allesverloren Shiraz on the table and a salt cellar close at hand in case of a little spill.

### **De Grendal Shiraz**

**R355**

True to the heritage of the Graaff family farm, De Grendal lies on the south-western slopes of Tygerberg and enjoys spectacular views of the Mother City. This Shiraz captures the exquisite taste and aromas of cosmopolitan Cape Town and its mix of east and west.

### **Hartenberg Shiraz**

**R365**

The wine that started my collection, back in the days. It cost me R7.21 in 1979 and I still enjoy sharing a bottle of Hartenberg Shiraz with good friends; drinkable at all times.

**Wine is the answer. I just don't remember the question.**

# RED WINES

## *Cabernet Sauvignon*
